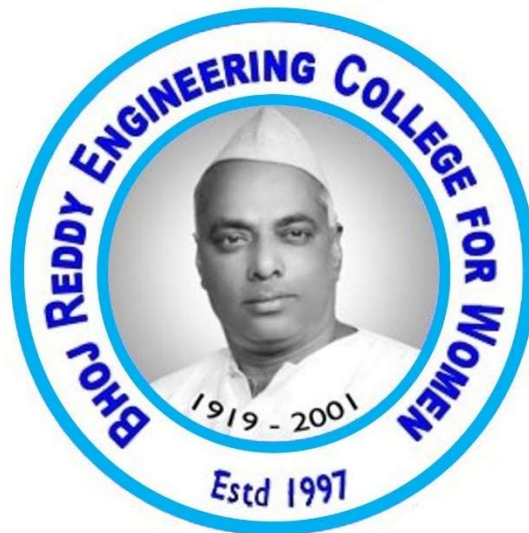

### Library:

The Library and Information Center (LIC), a Gateway to Knowledge Resources, is making use of the latest advances in the Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) to offer quality facilities to the students and staff of this College.

The Library is fully automated through VTLIS VIRTUA Integrated Library System Software with Cloud based Infrastructure. All circulation activities are done through Bar Coding System. The Software and the Cloud Infrastructure were renewed during 2024-25 with a cost of Rs 50,000 and Rs 2,11,928 respectively

The Library is exclusively housed in two floors with an area of 1800 sqm. Internet Section, Digital Library, Circulation Counter, Periodical Sections are housed in one floor. The Reading Halls, Loan Section, Competitive Exams Cell and Reference Sections are housed in the other floor. The reading halls accommodate more than 150 students and provide peaceful and friendly atmosphere for absorbing the knowledge available through books, journals, e-sources, etc.

Library is equipped with a huge collection of 38,792 volumes across 3,966 titles among which 260 volumes across 34 titles with a cost of Rs 3,02,556 were added in 2024-25

The Library has a collection of 55 printed National and International Journals costing Rs 2,11,514 during 2024-25

Orientation sessions were conducted on the usage of the above to all the Staff and Students. The same were renewed during 2024-25 with a cost of Rs 6,62,398, Rs 64,945 and Rs 13,570 respectively

The College Library has huge collection 6,974 volumes of fiction and nonfiction books for staff and students.

### **Laboratories:**

Keeping in view the fact that laboratories are the backbone of engineering education, bridging the gap between classroom learning and professional engineering practice, highest priority was given in ensuring the equipment is regularly updated to meet both academic requirements and industrial training standards.

During 2024-25, an amount of Rs 23,46,666 was spent to maintain and procure equipment of different laboratories in the college.

The Training and Placement Cell plays a vital role in shaping students' careers and enhancing their employability. It acts as a bridge between students and industry by organizing training programs, skill-development sessions, and campus recruitment activities.
